The Level 3 Championships saw an impressive turnout, with budding talent shining bright in the younger age groups. The competition was fierce, with neighbouring countries adding to the excitement.

Level 2 Championships: A Launchpad for Emerging Swimmers

This event marked a significant milestone for many young swimmers, and we were thrilled to see a strong showing. South African swimming boasts two standout qualities:

Overseas Achievements

Our overseas-based swimmers continue to make waves:

- Rebecca Meder (New Zealand): Achieved a World Champs qualifying time of 2:12.
- Ruard van Renen (NCAA Championships): Secured 3rd place in the 100m Back with a time of 43, ranking 7th on the all-time list.
- Aimee Canny (Women's NCAA): Won the B final in the 200m Free (1:42) and finished 7th in the 200m Breast-stroke final.

The SA Regional Level 3 Championships were successfully held across various venues:

 - o Total Athletes: 765
- KwaZulu-Natal: Arboretum Swimming Pool, Richards Bay, 26–29 March 2025
 - o Total Athletes: 203

These events showcased the depth of talent in our regions, with athletes delivering outstanding performances.
