High Performance (HP) – South Africa's Road to Glory

SA Senior Nationals (Port Elizabeth, 9-13 April)

Our elite swimmers delivered world-class performances at the perfectly sized 350-swimmer event, with multiple athletes achieving **World Champs qualifying times**. Olympic veterans **Pieter Coetzé** (2nd in 50/100/200 back) and **Rebecca Meder** (2nd in 200 breast) led our **Tier 1** contingent, while breakout stars like **Chris Smith** (3rd in 50 breast) signalled exciting depth. Relay prospects look strong with **six swimmers ranked Top 5 nationally** in freestyle events.

SA Junior Nationals (Cape Town, 25-29 April)

While the 840-swimmer event showcased exceptional talent in 12-14 age groups, the oversubscribed format compromised elite recovery. Performance analysis confirms the need to cap entries at 650 for optimal racing conditions.











Africa Junior Champs (Cairo, 30 April-3 May)

Team SA dominated with 25 total gold medals, including sensational performances from Jessica Thompson (5 gold, 3 Championship records), Keira van Heerden (4 gold), Scarlett le Roux (4 gold), and our women's squad (17 gold). The men's team showed promising development with Adrian van Wyk and Matthew Goller claiming 2 gold medals each.

Performance Insights:

- Post-Olympic cycle begins strongly with 4 swimmers ranked Top 10 globally in 7 events
- Junior pipeline excels internationally but needs 15-18 age group focus
- Operational adjustments required for junior nationals' optimization

The SA National Diving Championships was successfully held at St Dominic's, Gauteng from 8–12 April 2025. With emerging young talent, the event set the stage for upcoming international competitions.







SA National Swimming Championships

South Africa's fastest swimmers made waves at the SA National Swimming Championships at Newton Park Swimming Pool in Ggeberha from 9–13 April 2025.

Total Athletes: 344

The SA Nationals exceeded expectations, with several **National** and **Age Group Records** broken and standout performances from Pieter Coetzé, Rebecca Meder, Matt Sates, Kaylene Corbett, Michael Houlie, Chris Smith, and Erin Gallagher. All have qualified for the **World Aquatics Championships** in Singapore (11 July–3 August 2025), with swimming events taking place from 27 July–3 August!

It also saw thrilling races, new national records, and multiple qualifiers for the **World Para Swimming Championships** and **Deaflympics**.

Team SA made waves at the Africa Aquatics Water Polo Development Tournament in Harare, Zimbabwe from 11–13 April 2025.



Instructor Spotlight: Nyeleti Kubayi – Bringing Water Safety to Giyani by Nyeleti Kubayi, Learn-to-Swim Instructor & Founder of Star School of Swimming

My name is **Nyeleti Kubayi**, and I am a **qualified Learn-to-Swim instructor** based in **Giyani**, **Limpopo**. I would like to share my journey and express my deep passion for teaching swimming, especially in rural communities where water safety education is often overlooked.

My Swimming Journey

I began my swimming journey in 2018 with no prior experience. Coming from a rural area where









swimming isn't commonly taught, I quickly realized that this skill could one day **save lives**. Determined to make a difference, I took a major step in **2020** by enrolling in the **Learn-to-Swim Instructor course** with Limpopo Aquatics.

However, the path wasn't easy. I initially **failed the theory exam** and struggled to find a facilitator for my **practical assessment**. Despite these setbacks, I refused to give up. Then, in a life-changing moment, **Swimming South Africa (SSA) reached out to me**, offering a **free course** to complete my training. With their support, I finally became a **fully qualified instructor**.

Making an Impact in My Community

Today, I am the proud **founder of the Star School of Swimming** in Giyani, where I teach children essential swimming and water safety skills. I also collaborate with **Khanyisa Education Centre**, one of the best schools in the region, to bring structured swimming lessons to young learners.

My mission is simple: to ensure that no child in rural areas is left behind when it comes to water safety. I want to help others overcome the same barriers I faced and prove that anyone, from any background, can learn to swim.

A Message of Gratitude & Hope

I am deeply grateful to **Swimming South Africa** for believing in me and providing the opportunity to turn my passion into a purpose. My dream is to see more swimming programs in rural areas, more trained instructors, and **fewer drowning incidents** across South Africa.

If you're from a rural community and want to learn swimming or if you're inspired to become an instructor, **don't let challenges stop you!** With perseverance and the right support, anything is possible.
