Competitions – Thrills in the Pool & Open Water

17th Africa Aquatics African Swimming Championships

Oran, Algeria | 5-10 May 2026

South Africa's swimmers make waves across the continent!

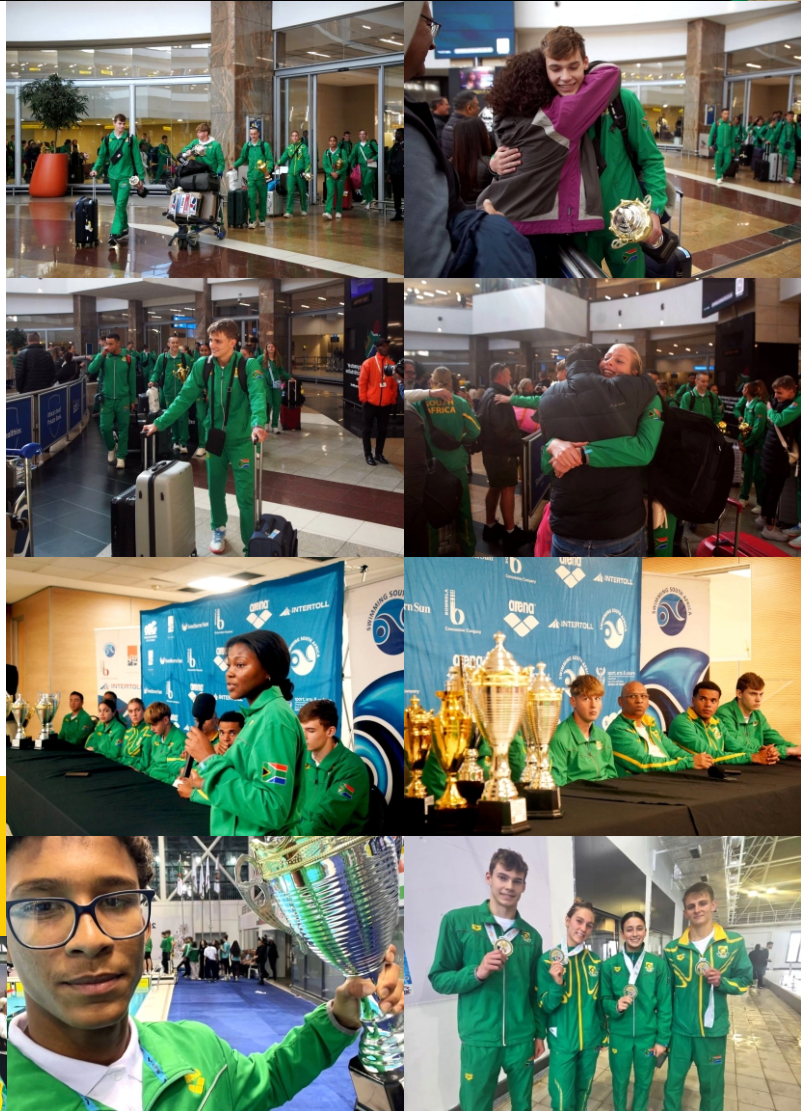
What a week it was in Oran. The 17th Africa Aquatics African Swimming Championships brought together 43 nations, but it was South Africa that truly stole the show.

Our junior team opened the African Champs 2026 with absolute fire in the pool, and the medals just kept coming. By the time the final touch was made, Team South Africa had amassed an extraordinary **84 medals** across the senior and junior competitions – proof that South African swimming has real depth, talent, and fighting spirit.

JUNIOR TEAM – TOP OF THE CONTINENT

The junior team was simply outstanding, finishing **1st on the continental medal table** with:

Gold	Silver	Bronze	Total
25	15	12	52



Junior Team Highlights:

Scarlett Le Roux was one of the stars of the championships, winning **five individual gold medals** and dominating the freestyle events from 100m right through to 1500m. Add to that a gold in the 800m freestyle to kick things off in style!



Cassidy Burgess had a brilliant championship, claiming **three individual golds** and two silvers in butterfly and backstroke.



Adrian van Wyk delivered a superb performance with **four individual gold medals** and a bronze, showcasing his incredible range.



Zaine Niemand added **three gold medals** of his own, proving the junior men's team has serious firepower.



Armand Landmann, just 17 years old, walked away as a **Double African Championships Record Breaker**:

- 100m Freestyle – GOLD & African Championship Record
- 50m Freestyle – GOLD & African Championship Record
- 50m Backstroke – BRONZE
- Plus relay golds and silvers, and the **Junior Men's Best Performance Trophy** with the highest FINA points of all junior men.



Mila Carine van der Linde produced a superb championship:

- Junior Women's 200m Backstroke – GOLD
- Junior Women's 50m Backstroke – SILVER
- Part of the winning Junior 4x200m Freestyle Relay
- Her 50m backstroke swim placed her among the top-ranked junior female swimmers by points.
